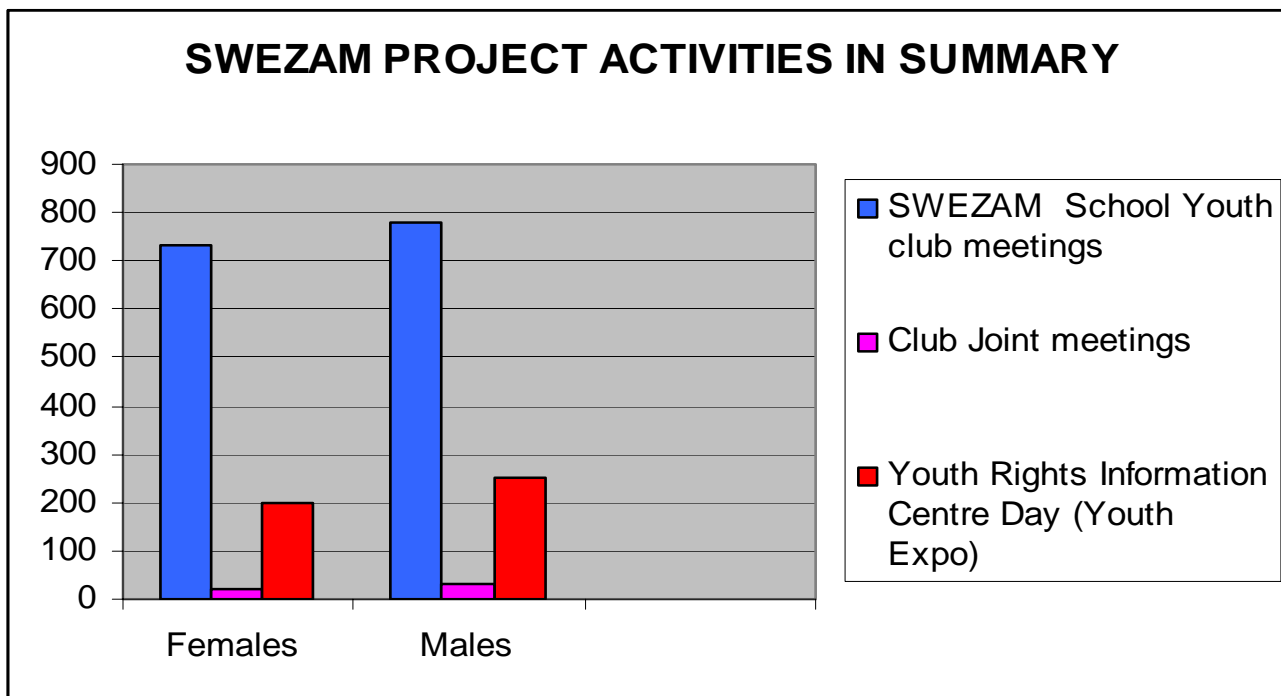

#### 3.1 Youth Rights Information Center Day (Youth Expo)

**Activity Date: 5<sup>th</sup> April, 2012**

**Number of participants reached: 490**

**Planned Amount: K 2,220,000**

**Actual Amount: K 2,220,000**

**Budget line Ref. No. 8.2**

**Venue: Mindolo Ecumenical Foundation –Charles Fisher Hall**

This year's event was held on 5<sup>th</sup> April, 2012 at Mindolo Ecumenical Foundation (MEF). The Youth Expo has become a traditional event on the SWEZAM Project calendar. The event attracted all the seven high schools were the SWEZAM Project runs clubs.

The clubs were accompanied by their school patrons and matrons to the event. The guest musicians were youthful their names being; “**Budsgy**” and “**So Sick**” from a local Radio station Flavor Fm, A Gospel Musician from Chingola and a motivation Speaker -**Mrs Nonde Bwalya Peters** from **Mano Event Planners!** All these delivered their presentations to the enjoyments and pleasure of the youth club members. With the number of members attending more that the one for last year the event was so full of life, noise and excitement to a point where the Human Resource Assistant Manager had to come and advise the youth organizer to try and inform the audience to be more quiet this hard task to do.

However, the traditional performances from



the school club members emitting from Human Rights, Gender and HIV/AIDS the schools included;

- **Music**
- **Poems**
- **Traditional Dances**
- **Drama/comedy**

Additionally, The SWEZAM Project club facilitators and coordinators exhibited materials and books that are found in YRIC information center. For the members that can not make it to MEF on weekly basis. This was done at the end of the meeting



## **4. Joint Planning Meetings**

### **4.1 Introduction and planning meeting with Coordinators and the new Intern**

**Activity Date: 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2012**

**Number of participants reached: 10 facilitators/coordinators**

**Planned Amount: K 5,040,000**

**Actual Amount: K 168,000**

**Budget line Ref. No1.3**

The 7<sup>th</sup> June 2012, Hanna Helander, a volunteer from Sweden, arrived to MEF for a six week internship at the SWEZAM youth project. The meeting hold the 8<sup>th</sup> June gave the coordinators an introduction of the intern as well as it gave the intern an introduction to the project and to the coordinators in charge of the different school clubs. The dates and times of school-clubs meetings and the club's outreaches where presented and a plan for the following weeks where set up for Annette Musonda and Hanna Helander to visit the school clubs activities. At the meeting the planning for the inter-School debate competition was initiated and it was decided to hold the debate in the thematic area of Human Rights.

#### **4.2 Joint meeting with Club Leaders and Club Facilitators Coordinators**

**Activity Date: 21<sup>th</sup> June, 2012**

**Number of participants reached: 15 SWEZAM School club leaders, 10 facilitators/coordinators and 3 youth skill for development members**

**Planned Amount: K 5,040,000**

**Actual Amount: K 420,000**

**Budget line Ref. No 1.3**

The purpose of the Joint meeting was to, together with all the involved youth, plan for the upcoming inter-School debate competition and to do the monthly evaluation about how the schools clubs are running. All participants were sharing their experiences from the school clubs and coordinators and leaders were evaluating the clubs together.

For the Inter School Debate Competition, the High Schools were picked and paired in groups for the knockout stages, and the rules for the competition were clarified. The schools are given motions to debate about, which were also decided at the meeting within the thematic area of Human Rights.

#### **5. SWEZAM School Youth Clubs Outreaches in Basic Schools From 2011 Budget**

**Activity Date: May and June 2012**

**Venues: Bulangilio Gurntone Basic Schools and St Francis Secondary School,**

The SWEZAM youth clubs have planning outreaches around some basic schools using the funding that is allocated under club capacity building. Out of the seven (7) clubs. Three have so far managed to conduct their outreaches. The clubs include; Mindolo SWEZAM Youth Club, Helen Kaunda SWEZAM Youth club and Mukuba Boys High School. The outreaches have been estimated at the receiving schools and it also brings a great value for the SWEZAM members who present. The topic for the student at the visited school.



### **5.1 Helen Kaunda SWEZAM Youth Club Outreach- Bulangililo Basic School**

Helen Kaunda SWEZAM Youth Club had the outreach at Bulangililo Basic School on 1 June 2012. It was an HIV/AIDS outreach. The club's two facilitators and coordinators made a presentation to the pupils present and the club members presented an HIV/AIDS drama play. The pupils learned more on how HIV is spread and the various preventative measures. The pupils enjoyed the meeting and were both participative and attentive during the meeting about 100 pupils were reached!

### **5.2 Mindolo SWEZAM Youth Club- Gurnatone Basic School**

Mindolo SWEZAM Youth club held their outreach on **22<sup>nd</sup> June, 2012** at Guarntone Basic the outreach attracted 22 Pupils, One SWEZAM Youth club patron, one SWEZAM facilitator/coordinator and SWEZAM youth club member.

The outreach was centered on Human Rights, which was presented by Chisha and Haggai, two members of Mindolo SWEZAM Youth club. The presentation was followed by a game chaired by Gift and a quiz based on the previous teaching, that turned out impressive as most of the pupils seemed to have understood. The quiz was chaired by the club members, Haggai and Jane. Prizes, in terms of books, pens and mathematical sets, were given out to the participants that answered questions. The finally activity on the agenda before closing remarks and prayer, was a sketch about child abuse, which involved the club members as well as a narration about the sketch done by Naomi. Afterward the school patron concluded in the outreach the teachers present during the outreach appreciated Mindolo SWEZAM Youth Club for visiting the school and appealed to them to find ways and means of a establishing a club at the Basic School.



### **5.3 Mukuba SWEZAM Youth club- St**



### **Francis Secondary School**

Mukuba SWEZAM Youth club had the outreach at St Francis Secondary School on **28<sup>th</sup> of June 2012**. Twelve SWEZAM School club members went for the outreach and there was 45 students attending at St Francis Secondary School. The topic presented was HIV/AIDS. The outreach was initiated with an introduction to SWEZAM by one of the coordinators for Mukuba's SWEZAM Club. The topic was presented by the leaders of the club. The presentation resulted in great participation from the pupils, questions and discussions about the effects of HIV on the body, the development of the disease and issues according to sexuality and preventative measures. St Francis Secondary school expressed their appreciation and wanted to receive the club for another visit.

### **5.4 Sacred Heart – Ndeke High School Swezam Youth Club Joint Executive meeting**

On **Friday 29<sup>th</sup> June, 2012**, Sacred Heart Secondary School SWEZAM Youth Club had a joint executive meeting with the newly elected executive of Ndeke High School. The meeting was held at Ndeke High School with 25 meeting attendants. 15 from the newly executive members while the remaining 10 were executive members from Sacred Heart Secondary School from the year 2011 to 2012. The purpose of the meeting was to help peer educators in the schools to know their roles and responsibilities by displaying exemplary leadership skills. The Club President from Sacred Heart, Nyondo Nelson, was facilitating the meeting, sharing experiences and knowledge to the new leaders in Ndeke High School.

The meeting agenda was as follows:

- Prayer
- Welcoming remarks
- Introduction
- Definition of peer education
  - **Rules and responsibilities of peer educators**
  - **Nature and traits of peer educators**
  - **Behavioral change**
  - **Peer educators as key players in the spread of information**
- Contributions
- Closing remarks
- Prayer

In total contract the meeting went well bearing in mind that the aims and objects were achieved.

Additionally, the weekly presence of the SWEZAM Facilitators/coordinators during club meetings has resulted in an increase of new members joining the clubs and the facilitation being conducted by them during meetings allows for constructive discussions on various topics within the thematic areas.

## 9. Recommendation

SWEZAM project should readily have the facilitators/coordinators as this will strengthen the clubs operations in high schools as the clubs are the life line of the project existence. Due to the fact that there are more pupils (youths) that can be reached! The School club patrons and matrons (teachers) of the clubs must now be seen as the SWEZAM project resource personnel as their inputs have proven to be irreplaceable!
